Papers shall be in the length of 3000-5000 words.

- **Headings:** All headings must be in Times New Roman, font size 14, and in bold.
- **File Format:** Abstracts and full manuscripts must be submitted in .doc or .docx format only.
- **Submission Process:** Participants are required to submit only the abstract initially.
- **Citation Style:** All footnotes must conform to the Bluebook, 20th Edition citation format.
