CONCEPT NOTE

"In spite of everything, I still believe that people are really good at heart."

Written by Anne Frank in *The Diary of a Young Girl* during the Holocaust, these words stand as a timeless testament to human resilience and the enduring faith in human dignity. That such hope could emerge from the depths of history's darkest chapters makes it not merely a personal confession but a powerful moral declaration that continues to resonate across generations.

It is this tension between the worst of human conduct and the best of human belief that lies at the heart of both law and literature. Law seeks to govern human behaviour, establish justice, and protect dignity; literature seeks to illuminate the human condition, give voice to the silenced, and bear witness to lived experience. Together, they form a vital and enduring conversation about justice, identity, and the kind of world we aspire to build.

The 21st century, shaped by technological advancement, shifting socio-political landscapes, and evolving conceptions of rights and justice, has lent renewed urgency to the notions of text, context, and interpretation. Legal and literary texts alike are not static artefacts rather their meanings are continuously constructed, contested, and transformed by the contexts in which they are read, applied, and challenged. Context has grown increasingly layered through globalisation, postcolonial legacies, identity politics, and socio-economic inequalities, as a result of which interpretation has become the critical site where law and literature converge.

This conference invites academicians, scholars, researchers, legal practitioners, and students to critically engage with the intersections of law and literature and to explore how navigating these disciplines together can offer deeper insights into justice, power, humanity, and our rapidly changing world.

OBJECTIVES OF THE CONFERENCE

- ▶ To examine the evolving relationship between text and context in the contemporary global scenario
- ▶ To analyse how legal and literary texts are continuously constructed, contested, and reinterpreted across changing contexts
- ▶ To explore how social, legal, cultural, and technological frameworks shape interpretations of human experiences.
- ▶ To foster interdisciplinary dialogue on issues related to identity, justice, power, and representation.
- ▶ To analyse contemporary challenges through literary, legal, and socio-cultural perspectives.

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SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Abstract

Research Papers → **Abstract** (250–300 words) (inclusive of 5 keywords)

For abstract: The abstract must be accompanied by a brief bio-note (in 100 words) of the author indicating their email ID, contact number, designation, and official address.

All submissions must include:

- Author's full name
- Institutional affiliation
- Contact email
- Short bio (100 words)

The abstract should be in the following format:

- Times New Roman, Font Size 12 & Line spacing 1.5, Justified.
- 1-inch margins on all four sides.
- Submissions are to be made in MS Word format only.

Please name your abstract file as follows:

Full Name_abstract, e.g., if the author's name is John Doe, then the file name should be John Doe_abstract. The abstracts can be submitted through this link:

Research Papers (4000–6000 words)

- Must present original research with clear research questions, methodology, analysis, and conclusion.
- Should engage with existing literature and contribute to theoretical or policy debates.
- Abstract (250–300 words) required, summarising the research problem, method, and findings.
- Proper citation and referencing required (APA/Bluebook style/MLA 9th Edition – as per conference format).

For citation, the author is required to follow the APA Formatting/MLA 9th Ed. or Blue Book Citation (12th Ed.).

The language of submissions should preferably be English & Hindi.

For Publication of Papers:

- Selected research papers may be published in an edited book by HNLU Press with an ISBN.
- The authors willing to consider their paper for publication must submit a duly filled-in and scanned 'DECLARATION OF RESPONSIBILITY & ASSIGNMENT OF COPYRIGHT FORM' to be provided with the communication of acceptance of the paper.
- The submitted papers shall be checked through a similarity software approved by the University.

- Any paper exceeding 10% similarity shall be outrightly rejected.
- The use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools in generating content is permissible only up to 20% of the total work. Authors must ensure that the paper reflects original analysis, interpretation, and argumentation.
- The submitted papers shall go through a rigorous blind peer-review process before selection for publication in an edited book with an ISBN as per the University Policies.
- Selection for paper presentation does not entitle publication in the book.
- The Committee reserves the right to disqualify any submission that does not comply with these guidelines.

NOTE

1. The registration fee is payable only after the acceptance of the abstract. Participants are required to attach a screenshot of the successful payment to the registration form. Once deposited, the payment is non-refundable, and the screenshot of the successful payment is to be attached to the registration form.
2. As the event will be for two days, the slot for the presentation will be made available beforehand.
3. Only quality papers will be selected for publication. Merely being a candidate allowed for presentation will not be the sole ground to claim publication until the author responds to the scrutiny suggested in the paper from time to time.
4. In case of more than one author in one paper, each author will pay the fee mentioned above individually.
5. There would not be any fee for the faculty and students of HNLU.
6. A certificate of presentation/Participation will be provided to the participants.
