Through this competition, students will engage with complex legal issues and present arguments before panels comprising experienced academicians, advocates, and members of the legal fraternity.

The competition seeks to bring together students from various law universities and institutions across the country, creating a platform for academic exchange and professional interaction. Participants will work in teams to analyse hypothetical legal problems, prepare written submissions, and argue their cases in a structured courtroom setting that closely resembles real judicial proceedings.

Gupta Moot Court Competition also aims to encourage critical thinking, ethical advocacy, and a more deeper understanding of constitutional and legal principles among budding lawyers. GENESIS

Hon'ble Mr. Justice Dwarka Prasad Gupta
Former Chief Justice of Rajasthan High Court



Hon'ble Mr. Justice Dwarka Prasad Gupta was born on 21 July 1926 at Nasirabad, Ajmer, Rajasthan, in the family of Late Shri Madho Prasad Gupta. He completed his B.Sc. from Maharaja College, Jaipur in 1944 and later obtained his LL.B. degree from Agra College, Agra in 1946. After completing his legal education, he enrolled as an Advocate in the Rajasthan High Court in 1950 at Jaipur and began his legal practice under Shri C. L. Agarwal, Senior Advocate. When the Jaipur Bench of the Rajasthan High Court was abolished in 1958, he shifted to Jodhpur and joined the chamber of Shri R. K. Rastogi, Advocate, and later started independent practice in the Rajasthan High Court at Jodhpur in 1961.

In recognition of his distinguished legal practice and professional excellence, Justice Dwarka Prasad Gupta was elevated as a Judge of the Rajasthan High Court on 24 September 1973. During his judicial career, he also served as Lokayukt of Rajasthan (Additional Duty) on 28 August 1978. He was appointed Acting Chief Justice of the Rajasthan High Court from 8 October 1980 to 30 October 1980, and again served as Acting Chief Justice from 8 August 1981 to 5 March 1982. In 1985, he assumed office as the Chief Justice of the Rajasthan High Court. Later, on 4 November 1985, he also served as the Governor of Rajasthan. After a distinguished judicial career marked by integrity and dedication to justice, Justice Dwarka Prasad Gupta retired on 31 July 1986 as Chief Justice of the Rajasthan High Court.

Babu Banarasi Das Ji, a born nationalist, in his early youth, joined hands with Mahatma Gandhi and Jawahar Lal Nehru in the movement to free India from the clutches of British rule.

During his long political career, he worked as a minister, speaker and member of Parliament (both Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha). He also held the position of chief minister of Uttar Pradesh. His entire life was devoted to securing the dignity of individuals through selfless service to mankind. He was a humanitarian who enabled people to realise their goals. He never believed in surrendering to any forces. Even in the face of death, he would not give in. “Man doth not yield himself to angels, not even unto death, utterly, except by the weakness of his feeble will.” Babuji always led and inspired people through his example, leaving behind a legacy for future generations. We are privileged to inherit that legacy and perpetuate his memory.

The Republic of Vakanda, a federal democratic nation modelled on constitutional principles akin to those of India, has long grappled with the challenge of balancing economic development with environmental sustainability. Over the past decade, the nation has witnessed an accelerated push toward industrial growth, driven by increasing energy demands, urbanization, and infrastructural expansion. Coal continues to remain the backbone of Vakanda's energy sector, accounting for nearly 60% of its electricity generation. In this context, the Union Government through its Ministry of Coal and Ministry of Environment, Forest and climate affairs (MEFCA) introduced the National Energy Expansion Policy, 2021, which emphasized the exploration and utilization of domestic coal reserves to reduce dependency on imports and ensure long-term energy security.

Within this developmental framework lies the Forever green Forest Region covers approximately 170,000, a vast contiguous stretch of dense forest located in the central belt of Vakanda. The region is ecologically significant, characterized by rich biodiversity, perennial river systems, and dense canopy cover that plays a crucial role in regulating climate patterns and maintaining ecological balance. It has historically been designated as an ecologically sensitive zone, and earlier governmental and expert committee reports had categorized large portions of it as "inviolable" or "No-Go Areas" for mining activities.

The Forever green forests are also home to several indigenous tribal communities, including the Koyra, Madvi, and Dharai tribes, who have resided in the region for centuries. These communities possess a symbiotic relationship with the forest, relying on it for sustenance, cultural practices, and traditional livelihoods. Their rights over forest land and resources are protected under statutory frameworks analogous to the Vakanda Forest Rights Act, 2006, which recognizes both individual and community rights, including the right to protect and manage forest resources.

The Geological Survey conducted between 2018-2021 revealed significant coal reserves beneath the forest land, leading to its inclusion in the commercial coal auction list. In 2022, following geological surveys indicating the presence of substantial coal reserves beneath the Forever green region, the Union Government initiated the process of auctioning coal blocks for commercial mining. Subsequently, mining leases were granted to private entities, including Trident Natural Resources Ltd. and Eastern Core Mining Pvt. Ltd. These corporations proposed large-scale open-cast mining operations, projected to significantly

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boost coal output and contribute to national economic growth.

To facilitate these projects, the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Affairs (MEFCA) granted environmental and forest clearances, asserting that all statutory requirements had been fulfilled. Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) reports were submitted, public hearings were purportedly conducted, and compensatory afforestation plans were proposed. The EIA reports allegedly did not adequately assess cumulative environmental impacts, wildlife disruption, and long-term ecological consequences. Public hearings, as part of the EIA process, were conducted in limited locations and allegedly excluded several directly affected villages. The government maintained that the projects adhered to the principles of sustainable development and included adequate safeguards for environmental protection and rehabilitation of affected communities. The forest clearance was granted subject to compensatory afforestation measures to be carried out in non-forest areas identified by the State.

The approval process soon became the subject of intense controversy. Several civil society groups, environmental activists, and local representatives alleged that the clearances were granted in a hurried and opaque manner. It was contended that the EIA reports were superficial, failed to adequately assess cumulative environmental impacts, and underestimated the extent of ecological degradation likely to result from mining operations. Furthermore, allegations emerged that the mandatory consent of Gram Sabhas, village assemblies empowered under law to safeguard community rights, was either improperly obtained or manipulated through coercion and misinformation.

The proposed mining activities threatened to lead to large-scale deforestation, fragmentation of wildlife habitats, and disruption of crucial ecological corridors, particularly affecting endangered species. Additionally, the displacement of thousands of tribal inhabitants raised serious concerns regarding violation of their fundamental rights, loss of livelihood, and erosion of cultural identity. Several Gram Sabhas reportedly passed resolutions opposing the mining projects, which were allegedly ignored by authorities.

Amid growing protests and resistance movements led by local communities, the Forest Protection Group, a collective representing affected villagers and environmental groups, emerged as the primary petitioner. The Samiti organized peaceful demonstrations, filed representations before administrative authorities, and sought intervention from regulatory bodies, including the National Green Tribunal. However, the Tribunal declined to grant an interim stay on the project, observing that prima facie procedural compliance had been demonstrated.

Left with no alternative remedy, the Petitioners approached the Supreme Court of Vakanda under its writ jurisdiction, invoking the violation of fundamental rights guaranteed under the Constitution, particularly the right to life and livelihood. They challenged the legality and constitutionality of the environmental and forest clearances, arguing that the State had failed in its duty as a trustee of natural resources and had

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prioritized economic interests over ecological integrity and human rights.

The case now presents a complex constitutional dilemma involving the intersection of environmental law, tribal rights, administrative decision-making, and the doctrine of sustainable development. It calls upon the judiciary to determine the extent to which economic policies can impinge upon fundamental rights and whether procedural compliance alone suffices in matters with far-reaching ecological and social consequences.

The matter is presently pending adjudication before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of Vakanda.

ISSUES FOR ADJUDICATION

Issue I: Whether the Writ Petition filed by the Forest Protection Group is maintainable before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of Vakanda, given the existence of an alternative statutory remedy and the National Green Tribunal's prior observation on procedural compliance.

Issue II: Whether the grant of Environmental and Forest Clearances by the Ministry of Environment, Forest, and Climate Affairs (MEFCA) is vitiated by administrative arbitrariness and a failure to apply the 'Precautionary Principle'.

Issue III: Whether the inclusion of the Forever Green Forest Region in commercial coal auctions violates the Constitutional and Statutory rights of the indigenous tribal communities.

Issue IV: Whether the mandatory requirement of 'Prior Informed Consent' from the Gram Sabhas was substantively bypassed, and if such an omission renders the mining leases granted to Trident Natural Resources Ltd. and Eastern Core Mining Pvt. Ltd. void *ab initio*.

Issue V: Whether the National Energy Expansion Policy, 2021, and the subsequent coal mining projects strike a constitutionally valid balance between the 'Right to Development' and the 'Right to a Healthy Environment'.
