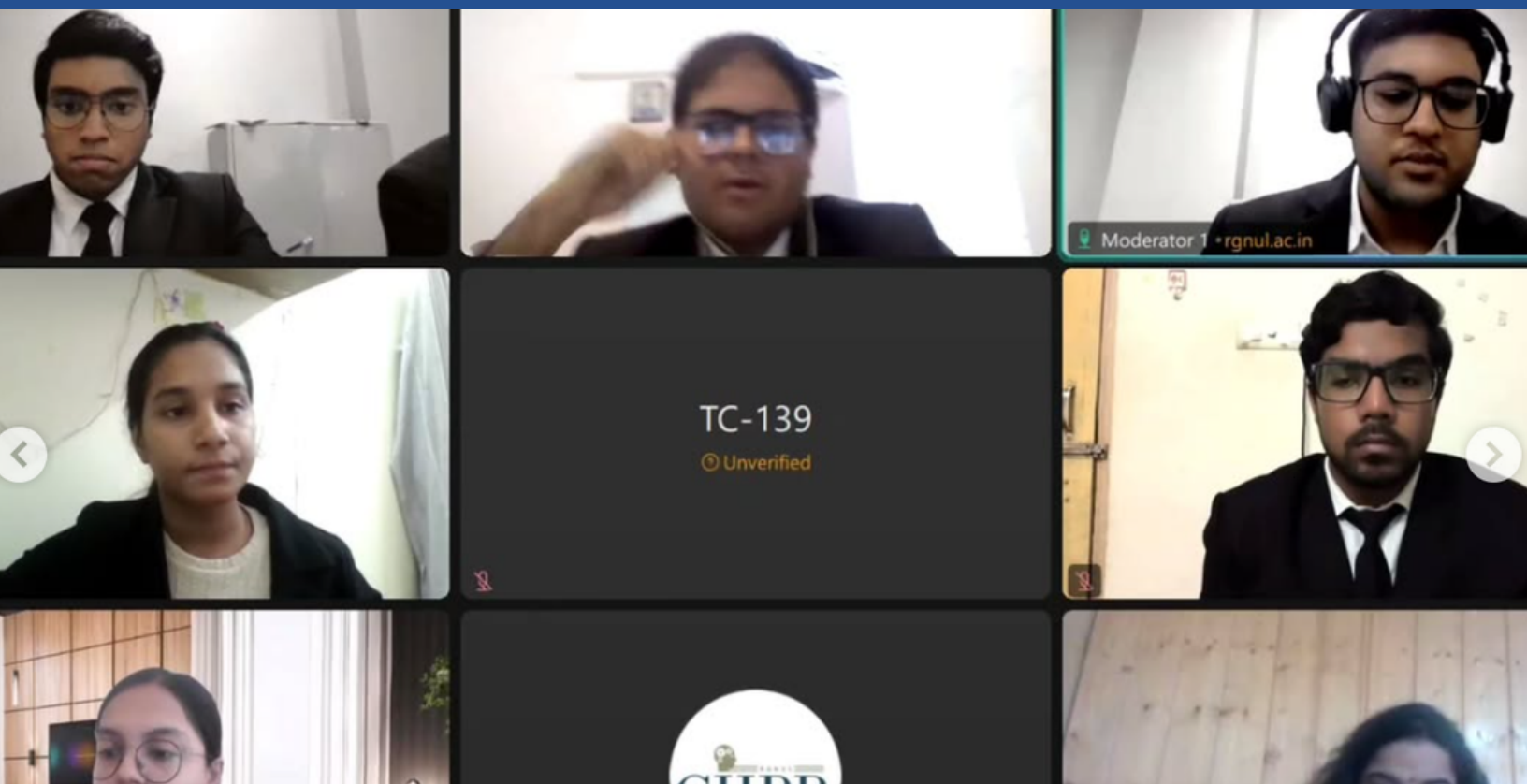

FORMAT OF THE COMPETITION

The competition shall entail mandatory registration, following which participants shall be required to submit a final draft of 2,500–3,000 words, inclusive of the abstract and exclusive of footnotes. The abstract shall comprise 200–250 words, followed by the full paper addressing any one of the themes specified below.

The winners shall be declared upon the completion of the blind peer-review process. The paper presentations shall be conducted in online mode.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- **Eligibility:** The competition is open exclusively to undergraduate students. Cross-institutional teams are permitted.
- **Authorship:** Each submission may have a maximum of two authors.
- **Language:** The submission must be written in English only.
- **Word Limit:** The final manuscript must comprise 2,500–3,000 words, inclusive of the abstract and exclusive of footnotes.
- **Abstract:** Each submission must include an abstract of 200–250 words.
- **Citation Style:** All submissions must strictly adhere to the OSCOLA 4th Edition.
- **Similarity:** The similarity index must not exceed 15%. Submissions exceeding the prescribed limit shall be liable to rejection.
- **AI Usage:** The use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools for generating, drafting, rewriting, paraphrasing, or substantially modifying the manuscript is strictly prohibited. Any violation shall result in disqualification.
- **Originality:** The manuscript must be the original and unpublished work of the author(s). It must not have been previously published or submitted simultaneously to any other competition, journal, or publication.
- **Exclusive Submission:** An author/team may make only one submission. Multiple submissions, whether as a single author or co-author, shall result in the disqualification of all concerned entries.
- **Formatting:** The following formatting specifications must be strictly adhered to:
 - **Main Body:** Times New Roman, 12-point font, 1.5 line spacing, justified alignment.
 - **Footnotes:** Times New Roman, 10-point font, 1.0 line spacing, justified alignment.
 - **Margins:** 1 inch (2.54 cm) on all sides.
- **Submission Format:** The final manuscript must be submitted in DOC/DOCX format through the designated Google Form before the prescribed deadline.
- **File Naming:** The final manuscript must be named strictly in the format “Team Code”. The Team Code shall be communicated to registered participants subsequently.
- **Anonymity:** The name(s), institution(s), contact details, or any other information indicating the identity of the author(s) must not appear anywhere in the manuscript. Any breach of anonymity shall result in disqualification.
- **Concurrent Submission:** Author(s) shall refrain from submitting the manuscript elsewhere during the pendency of the review and evaluation process.

DOUBLE-BLIND REVIEW PROCESS

The submissions shall undergo a two-stage double-blind review process:

Stage I – Technical Review:

All submissions shall first undergo a technical screening to assess compliance with the prescribed word limit, formatting requirements, citation style, similarity threshold, anonymity requirements, and other submission guidelines. Submissions failing to satisfy the mandatory technical requirements may be rejected at this stage.

Stage II – Content-Based Review:

Submissions qualifying the technical review shall proceed to a content-based double-blind peer review, wherein the identity of both the author(s) and the reviewer(s) shall remain undisclosed. The manuscripts shall be assessed on the basis of their quality of research, depth of analysis, originality, legal reasoning, clarity, coherence, and overall contribution to the discourse on Intellectual Property Rights.

The outcome of the review process shall determine the entries shortlisted for the virtual paper presentation.

JUDGING CRITERIA

The submissions shall be evaluated on the following parameters:

- Relevance and depth of analysis of the chosen IPR theme;
- Originality of thought, argument, and perspective;
- Quality of legal and policy research and accuracy of citations;
- Clarity, coherence, and structure of the writing;
- Strength of legal reasoning and analysis;
- Overall contribution to contemporary discourse on Intellectual Property Rights;
- and
- Adherence to the prescribed formatting and submission requirements.

VIRTUAL PRESENTATION & FINAL EVALUATION

Shortlisted participants shall be required to virtually present their articles before an esteemed panel of assessors. The presentations shall be evaluated on the basis of the participants' understanding of the subject, quality of analysis, articulation of arguments, presentation skills, and responses to questions posed by the assessors.

The assessment and scores awarded by the panel of assessors shall be final and binding, and the final rankings shall be determined on the basis of the scores awarded in accordance with the prescribed evaluation criteria.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

- The Centre reserves the right to summarily reject or return any submission that does not comply with the prescribed guidelines.
- Articles violating any of the submission guidelines shall be summarily rejected.
- Late or incomplete submissions shall not be considered under any circumstances.
- The name and institution of the author(s) must not be mentioned anywhere in the submitted manuscript.
- The decision of the Review Panel and Panel of Judges shall be final and binding.
- The organisers reserve the right to make decisions regarding any matter not expressly covered under these guidelines.



THEMES

- Patent Exhaustion and the Limits of Post-Sale Control Over Repair and Emerging Areas
- Copyright, Computational Learning and the Limits of Permissible Use in Training Large Language Models
- Trademark Protection of Product Appearance After the Expiry of Design Rights
- Geographical Indications, Tribal Displacement and the Continuity of Community-Based Product Identity
- Trans-border Reputation and the Territorial Limits of Trademark Protection in the Global Digital Marketplace

Note: The themes provided are indicative and non-exhaustive in nature. Participants are free to choose a topic beyond the listed themes, provided it falls within the broader scope of Intellectual Property Rights.

AWARDS AND PRIZES

The top three entries will be awarded cash prizes:

1st Prize: ₹15,000
2nd Prize: ₹10,000
3rd Prize: ₹6,000

In addition to the cash prizes, the top two entries will be offered an **internship opportunity** at **S.S. Rana & Co.**

Note: Internship opportunities will be offered exclusively to 4th and 5th-year students of the B.A. LL.B. programme and 3rd-year students of the 3-year LL.B. programme

Furthermore, the **Top 10 ranked articles**, as selected by the Review Panel, will be published in the official CIIPR Journal/Book and on the CIIPR website.

All participants will also receive Certificates of Participation in recognition of their contribution.
