Guidelines for Abstract:

1. Title of the abstract: Times New Roman, font size 14.
2. The abstract should contain personal details of the author(s) in the order: Title of the Paper, Name, Designation, Institute/University/College/Organisation, Contact Number, E-mail, and Address of Correspondence of the Author(s).
3. Main Text- 150- 300 Words, Times New Roman, font size 12, 1.5 spacing, justified, with a margin left 1.5 inch and right 1.0-inch, top 1 inch and bottom 1 inch. The first line of the paragraph is not to be indented.
4. Keywords: 5 key words.

Note: Abstracts will be Published as Conference Proceedings with ISBN Number.

Springer Publication - Selected good Quality papers will be published in Atlantis Press (Springer Nature) (Publication Charges will be INR 12,500/- for a selected paper).

5. Kindly indicate the name of the main author for correspondence in case of more than one author.

Guidelines for submission of full paper:

1. Author guidelines - Please follow the guidelines for proper format of writing: Authors details, Affiliation, Mail id, ORCID Margins, line spacing. Id. Maximum Three authors are allowed including main author. One of the authors must have Doctorate/Ph.D.
2. Abstract (150-300 words and 5 key words), Full paper (2500-3000 words, excluding references).
3. Footnotes and references are mandatory.
4. APA citations: Please ensure that all information in your manuscript that is taken from another source is substantiated with an in-text reference citation. The publisher will return your submission to you for correction if you do not properly format your references. Only papers registered and presented at the conference will be considered for publication.
5. Similarity: should not exceed 10%.
6. AI Similarity must be less than 10%.

1. Selected high-quality papers, after undergoing the prescribed peer-review process, shall be considered for publication in the **Springer Nature (Atlantis Press Book Proceeding Series)**. Publication in Springer Nature is subject to the acceptance of the paper by the **Springer Nature** and compliance with all prescribed guidelines.
2. Authors opting for publication in the Springer Nature proceedings shall be required to pay a **publication fee of ₹12,500/- per paper**, which includes the Article Processing Charges (APC) and other associated publication expenses.

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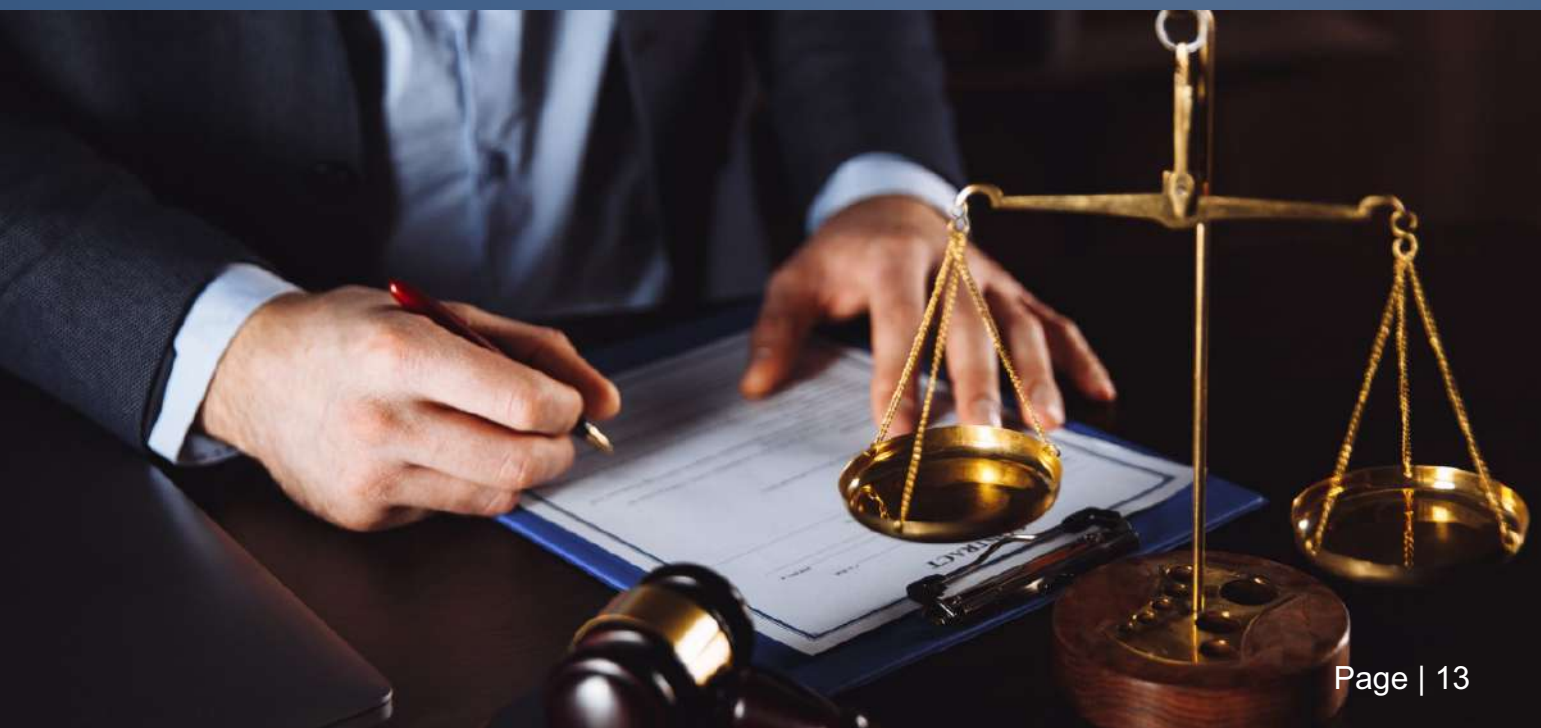
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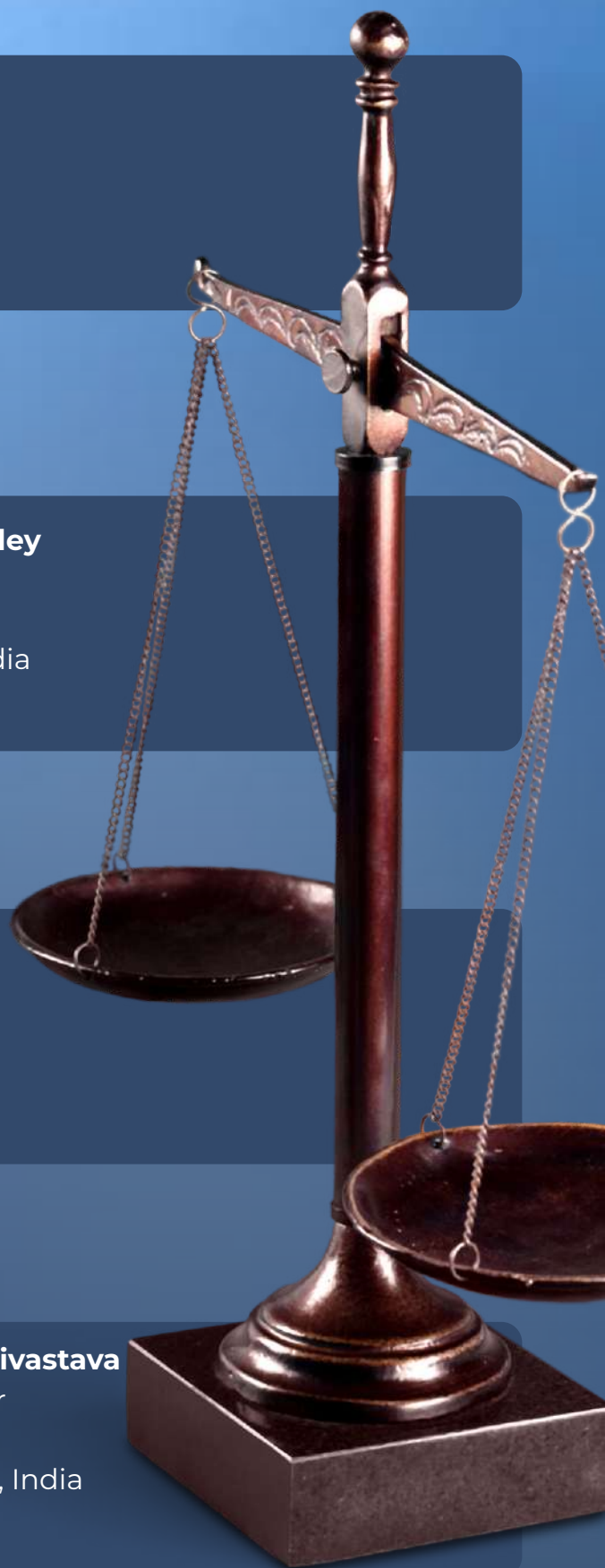
